The University of Law, Leeds Legal Advice Clinic provides free legal advice on a range of areas of law to members of the public. This service is provided free to the community by local solicitors and barristers, who are shadowed and assisted by our students. As our advisors are all volunteers the service provides initial advice only and the clinic is not able to undertake casework or represent clients in court.



HOW DOES THE CLINIC WORK?

If you need advice, contact us on the number below, leave a message and one of our student administrators will telephone you back to take details of your legal query. Our clinic supervisor will assess whether yours is a suitable case to be taken on. If we are able to help, we will contact you to arrange an appointment. In some instances the clinic may not be able to assist if your query is outside the remit of our volunteers' experience.

At your appointment you will be seen by a qualified solicitor or barrister, who will be accompanied by one of our students. You will receive legal advice and this will be followed up by a written letter of advice prepared by our students, supervised by qualified legal professionals, which you will receive within 2-3 weeks of the appointment itself.
